

CHIEF COMPLAINT:

1. Headache
2. Fever
3. Stress
4. Insomnia
5. Altercation

HISTORY OF PRESENT ILLNESS: This 44-year old single white female is a new patient to our clinic today. She presents with complaints of having had bad headaches in the frontal, maxillary and parietal areas, especially on the right side, for the last few days. She thinks she did have some fever last night and has been very achy over the last couple of days. She has had some nausea only once earlier today. She also mentioned that she's been in an altercation about seven weeks ago. She states that her boyfriend, who was from Italy, got in a fight with her and continued to punch her and hit her with various things. She went into great detail of all of the terrible things that she went through including torture and sexual assault. This occurred in California. She was tied up for about five days and finally she was able to escape. She did seek medical help a few days later. She had numerous x-rays and received medical help including medications. She had been taking some Celebrex and she'd also had a jaw dislocation during the time she was getting punched. She states she was actually starting to feel a little bit better over the last few weeks until the last couple of days started coming down with what she thought was a viral type syndrome. She states she has not been sleeping well at night ever since her ordeal. She also mentioned she has two rib fractures on the right side and I believe she said the 10th and 11 ribs secondary to her boyfriend kicking her. She also mentioned that she did tell the police about the incident and they are looking for him but they think he may have fled the country. She has family and friends here in Oklahoma and has come here to stay to escape.

PAST MEDICAL HISTORY:

1. Hysterectomy and bilateral salpingo-oophorectomy approximately in 1982, otherwise she is healthy.

CURRENT MEDICATIONS:

1. Estrace 2-mg daily
2. Over the counter Benadryl and Aspirin for her symptoms recently

DRUG ALLERGIES:

1. Codeine
2. Iodine
3. She states she has taken Darvocet before without any allergic reaction

EXAMINATION: Shows an afebrile female. Blood pressure 108/72 and pulse 92. She appears to be having some pain and appears a little tired and prefers to lie down on her right side.

HEENT: Head: Normocephalic. She does appear to have some slight ecchymosis around the eyes where she was punched. She has no other swelling of the head or scalp area. No battle signs. Maxillary sinus areas are a little tender. She has no swelling of the maxillary or zygomatic arches. No swelling of her jaw. She is a little tender over the right TMJ area, no signs of swelling or discoloration though.

Temporomandibular joint and EAC appear normal. Nose: Moderate erythema, only a small amount of yellow crust. Throat: Clear.

NECK: Supple without lymphadenopathy.

LUNGS: Clear bilaterally

HEART: Regular without murmur
