

INTERVIEW OF REBECCA WHITE:

On 12-1-05 at 2:10 p.m., I spoke with victim Rebecca White by phone. I audiotaped the following conversation:

Rebecca assumed her jaw had been dislocated as a result of defendant Carlo Parlanti slapping her because she "had trouble talking" and her "mouth was crooked" afterwards. Rebecca explained, "Because the next morning when I was able to wake up and be aware of myself, I took my jaw and pressed it back—it popped back in place. So I would call that dislocated."

She never sought medical treatment for the injury, nor did she report it to Dr. Manchester.

Rebecca was examined by Dr. Fore in Ardmore. "He said, You have a cracked skull. He told me, There's no way you don't. Because I did not have a cold and clear fluid was running out of my nose. And it had been all this time. I just thought it was a cold. I didn't know that it was spinal fluid."

Dr. Fore told Rebecca to go across the street to the hospital for x-rays. When asked if she followed his instructions, she said, "No. Because I didn't understand that California would pay for it. And I didn't have any insurance. I had zero money."

She added that she had been having "flashbacks". "And I didn't know what they were," she said, "until I started going to this brain injury clinic thing that I've been going to since June. He

kicked me in the head—I don't think that's in anything. 'Cause I didn't understand what a flashback was. I mean, I could be walking somewhere, and I feel it and I see it. I don't think that's in any of the records."

I retained the original audiotape of the interview in my case file for evidence.
